**David S. Strayer** received his M.D. and Ph.D. degrees from the Pritzker School of Medicine, University of Chicago. He did his residency in anatomic pathology at Barnes Hospital-Washington University, St. Louis. He has been on the faculty of the Pathology Departments at the University of California, San Diego and Yale University. Dr. Strayer has been an attending pathologist and Professor at Thomas Jefferson University since 1992, and has a research program in gene therapy and AIDS. He has published over 150 articles in scientific and clinical journals, and is on the editorial boards of several prominent publications.

**Raphael Rubin, M.D.**, is a graduate of Boston University School of Medicine. After his residency in anatomic pathology at New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center and postdoctoral studies at the University of Pennsylvania, he joined the faculty of Thomas Jefferson University, where he is Professor of

Pathology. In addition to his clinical expertise in liver pathology, Dr. Rubin has published extensively in the fields of hepatic disease and alcoholic tissue injury.
